

References/Citations and Notes:

You are encouraged to use as many references in writing your lab report as possible, especially when writing the introduction where you're providing background and context. The internet is a valid source, as are texts and scientific journals. The following are examples of properly formatted source references. When referencing an author's or editor's name, it's proper to give the last name followed by a comma and then the first and middle initials (ex.: Smith, A. B.)

Books with Editors:

Author 1; Author 2. In *Book Title*; Editor 1, Editor 2, Eds.; Publisher: Place of Publication, year; volume, chapter, pages.

Books without Editors:

Author 1; Author 2. *Book Title*; Publisher: Place of Publication, year; volume, chapter, pages.

Scientific Journals:

Author 1; Author 2. *Journal Title* **year**, *volume*, pages.
